4. Case study/ topic summary:

In this intensive case, semi-structured in-depth interviews with Swiss farmers were conducted to explore how farmers construct the relationship between their religious and/or spiritual beliefs and biodiversity. In total, 22 farmers were interviewed, and data included audio-recorded interviews and subsequently verbatim transcripts of these interviews. Analysis included thematic content analysis of the text as well as pictures and/or short films if provided by the farmers or allowed for the researchers to produce, describing the relationship between farmers and their biodiversity-related farming behaviour in a displayed format. A select number of these visual displays with the corresponding narrations were used to launch 5 mini-photo exhibitions including a presentation in four community locations. Feedback from audience was collected in four of these events. Two manuscripts and a podcast along with 4 articles in magazines and community newspapers, were produced based on this study.
